

# ACADEMIC LITERACIES PROGRESSION POLICY, UG – FROM FALL 2025 ENTRY ONWARDS

#### Introduction

1. This policy details the University's expectations for undergraduate students completing the compulsory Academic Literacies programme as part of the liberal arts requirements of for all programmes.

### **General Principles**

## Year One Entry

- 1. Students admitted to Year One Entry must complete the following courses:
  - a Level 3 Fundamentals of English for Academic Writing and Oracy
  - b Level 3 Fundamentals of Research and Writing
- 2. New students have three semesters from their first semester of entry to complete both courses. For the avoidance of doubt, students could repeat one failed course within this period, not both.
- 3. Students who cannot complete both courses within the required time frame may be dismissed from the University for failure to progress academically.

#### Year Two Entry or Progressing to Year Two

- 4. Students admitted to Year Two Entry or progressing to Year Two must complete the following course: Level 4 Academic Research and Writing.
- 5. New students have two semesters from their first semester of entry to complete the course.
- 6. Year One Entry students progressing to Year Two will have two semesters from starting Year Two to complete the course. For the avoidance of doubt, Year One Entry students have a total of five semesters to complete all three components of the Academic Literacies programme.

7.	Students who cannot complete these courses within the required time frame may be
	dismissed from the University for failure to progress academically. Students who are
	not dismissed must be aware that this will delay their graduation date and as such may
	put their visa sponsorship and/or student funding at risk.
