

DECLARING AND CHANGING A MAJOR POLICY

Introduction

- 1. When applying for admission, students indicate an area of interest for study by choosing one of the undergraduate degree programmes offered at the University and will be registered in that major upon entry.
- 2. Students not declaring a major when they apply will be categorized as undeclared majors.

General Principles

- 3. Students are required to declare a major on completion of 56 US /224 UK credits.
- 4. Students may change major at any point.
 - a This may impact upon their time-to completion.
 - b Students must discuss plans to change major with their academic advisor so that any alteration to their progression can be explored.
 - c Visa-sponsored students must discuss plans to change major with the UKVI Compliance team. A change of Major will be reported to UKVI, and a delayed time-to completion may require application for a new student visa.
- 5. Students will follow the major requirements in effect at the time of their admission to the University. Exceptions may only be granted by Registry Services, with the agreement of the Head of School or Department.
