

CREDIT HOUR POLICY: POSTGRADUATE

General Principles

1. At the postgraduate level, one US credit is equivalent to:
 - a. 2.5 European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) credits
 - b. 5 UK credits
2. The credit equivalency for US and UK credits at the postgraduate level differs from that at the undergraduate level, as additional independent study hours are required at the postgraduate level. This is reflected in the notional hours of learning calculated for credit in the UK, but the US credit calculation remains rooted in contact hours.
3. A typical postgraduate course consists of 4 US/20 UK credits which normally corresponds to 39 contact hours across the standard 13 week semester. Contact hours may consist of both timetabled hours in the physical classroom, and a small amount of guided learning hours.
4. Some L7 courses run at different credit values and for different durations, and students should refer to their individual Course Specification Documents (CSDs) and/or syllabi to understand the weekly hours per course.
5. The difference between undergraduate and postgraduate ratios of classroom time to credit is a result of increased expectations for research time outside of the classroom.
6. For out of classroom experiences, such as internships, a standard 4 US /20 UK credit postgraduate course normally has 300 total hours over 6 weeks. This generally includes 8 hours for guided learning and the rest are normally assigned to independent learning hours.
