Course Description:

This course provides a comprehensive understanding of the fashion product development process, from creative concept to consumer product. Students will develop skills in market research, trend cycle analysis alongside design development, production planning, and manufacturing processes. The course combines theoretical knowledge with practical applications and an understanding of sustainable issues to prepare students for careers in the global fashion industry.

Aims and Objectives:

- To enable students to analyse and predict fashion trends using various forecasting tools and techniques.
- To develop students' ability to conduct market research to identify consumer needs and preferences.
- To equip students with project management skills to oversee the development process from concept to completion.
- To instil an understanding of sustainable practices in fashion product development, including ethical sourcing and production methods.
