Course Description: The student brings together many of their degree's acquired skills to create a substantial piece of theatre culminating in a public performance of their chosen project. The student, in consultation and agreement with the department may choose any single element or combination of the following: Write; and/or Act; and/or Direct; and/or Design; and/or Produce a play or theatrical performance event. Students may combine with others to share and achieve various aspects of their production. Note that this course is restricted to THR majors only. Study Abroads may not register for this course.

Prerequisites: THR 5200 or THR 5210 or THR 5215. THR majors only. Study Abroad students may not register for this course

Aims and Objectives: Students will present a substantial piece of theatre to the public. They will have demonstrated and put to the test many of the skills they have

gained during their three years studying for the Drama Major and document reflectively on their project achievement.
