Students may combine with others to share and achieve various aspects of their production. Note that this course is restricted to THR majors only. Study Abroads may not register for this course.

Aims and Objectives:

Students will present a substantial piece of theatre to the public. They will have demonstrated and put to the test many of the skills they have gained during their three years studying for the Drama Major and document reflectively on their project achievement.
