I. Our Learning Experience

Together we will: Commit ourselves to working hard to achieve our goals.

As a student I will: Attend, and prepare for, all my scheduled classes and other meetings, such as new student orientation and meetings with academic advisors.

Finish all my assignments and submit them within the time constraints given to me.

Understand that I am free to declare any concerns that will affect my learning experience (such as illness or disability), so that I can be supported by the University.

As a University we will:

Provide you with excellent teaching and learning opportunities.

Promote internationalism in all that we do at the University both inside and outside of the classroom.

Consult with you and treat you as a partner in regards to changes that may affect your experience at the University.

Ensure the curriculum is up-to-date and use our research, where feasible and appropriate, to inform the curriculum.

Support you in your studies through academic advice and other academic support services that allow you to personalize your learning experience.

Make sure you have access to advice, counselling and other specialist support services (such as support if you are a disabled student) for the duration of your time at the University.

2. Personal and academic development

Together we will:

Actively engage with all learning opportunities with the goal of challenging and supporting students to reach their full potential.

As a student I will:

Grasp opportunities to learn and reflect on my own development as it relates to my personal and academic goals.

Prepare for employment and take part in activities that aid both in my academic and personal development.

As a University we will:

Make sure you have access to a range of opportunities to improve your skills and employability, and encourage you to engage with such opportunities.

Make sure that you have a diverse range of extra-curricular and co-curricular activities available to you that underpin the University's commitment to internationalism and global citizenship.

Take steps to prepare you for citizenship and leadership in a diverse, global environment.

Provide you with access to careers information, guidance and support so that you can enter the world of work informed and prepared.



3. Communicating and interacting with each other

Together we will: Communicate openly, respectfully and honestly with each other and engage in constructive dialogue.

As a student I will: Inform myself by reading University communications and responding in a timely way.

Take part in monitoring and feeding back information that will aid in evaluating my learning experience.

Express my views to student representatives and course leaders so that these views can be represented effectively.

Provide you with information to help you plan your studies and participate actively in your University experience, including transparent information about University policies and procedures such as costs, timetables, course registration and support services.
